# Component Definitions:

<u>Tuition & Fees</u> – an amount normally assessed a student carrying the same academic workload.

Books, course materials, supplies and equipment – an allowance for books, course materials, and equipment, which includes all such costs required of all students in the same course of study, including reasonable allowance for the rental or upfront purchase of a computer.

<u>Laptop/Computer Expenses</u> – the average cost for a personal computer, charged at a rate of \$750 per academic year, to be charged during one semester. Not to be charged over two semesters or year to year. Students may request this component on a case-by-case basis. Approved one-time while in attendance at RU and is included in the Equipment COA component total.

Transportation - may include transportation between campus, residencies, and place of work, as determined by the institution.

Commuter Living Expenses - Living with Parent - Food (3 meals a day) and Housing (standard allowance for rent or other housing costs)

Living expenses—An allowance for food and housing costs, as determined by the institution, to be incurred by the student, including a reasonable standard allowance for expenses incurred while living at home including utilities and meals, etc.

Commuter Living Expenses - Living Off Campus - Food (3 meals a day) and Housing (standard allowance for rent or other housing costs)

Living expenses—an allowance for food and housing costs, as determined by the institution, to be incurred by the student, including meals, and rent or other housing costs.

Resident Living Expenses – with dependents - Food (3 meals a day) and Housing (standard allowance for childcare)

Living expenses—an allowance for food and housing costs, as determined by the institution, to be incurred by the including a standard food allowance that provides the equivalent of three meals each day. including a childcare allocation. The childcare allocation is an allowance for childcare expenses based on an hourly rate charged to all students with similar academic loads. Students may request this component on a case-by-case basis.

Resident Living Expenses – without dependents – Food (3 meals a day) and Housing

Living expenses—An allowance for food and housing costs, as determined by the institution, to be incurred by the student including a standard food allowance that provides the equivalent of three meals each day. Amount based on actual room and board charges per contract at the institution.

#### Commuter Living Expenses- Military Base (not on the COA chart)

For students living in housing on a military base or for which they receive a basic allowance under section 403(b) of title 37, United States Code, institutions must include a reasonable allowance for food on-campus or off-campus but cannot include housing costs.

Federal Student Loan fees - An allowance for the cost of any Federal student loan fee, or insurance premium charged to the student or the parent of the student.

<u>Miscellaneous personal expenses</u> – the average cost includes medical, clothing, hygiene, and communications. This amount is applied for all students who are registered at least half time.

<u>Dependent Care Expenses</u> – Childcare expenses are not automatically included, although they may be included on a case-by-case basis upon request from the student. Proof of estimated expenses must be provided.

<u>Disability-related expenses</u> – For a student with a disability, an allowance for expenses related to the student's disability can be included upon the student's request. Expenses may include personal assistance, transportation, supplies that are reasonably incurred. Proof of estimated expenses must be provided.

Study abroad expenses – Study abroad programs depend on a range of factors including tuition, flights, meals, health insurance, etc. Students may request this component on a case-by-case basis if registered to attend a student abroad program.

<u>Professional licensure, certification, or a first credential cost</u> – Component may be provided one time per student, per eligible academic program. Examples of allowable costs include fees for licensing exams, costs incurred in traveling, etc. This component may be added upon request from the student on a case-by-case basis. Proof of license cost must be provided.

<u>Cooperative education costs</u> – For students engaged in a work experience through a cooperative education program and allowance for reasonable costs associated with such employment. Students may request this component to be added to their cost of attendance on a case-by-case basis.
